Jamael Tito Brown is a transformational public-sector executive with more than three decades of leadership experience spanning municipal governance, fiscal management, community development, and organizational strategy. His career reflects a data-driven, performance-focused approach to government operations, economic revitalization, and cross-sector collaboration.

A graduate of Youngstown State University, Brown holds a Bachelor of Arts and Science in Criminal Justice with a minor in Social Work, and a Master's degree in Clinical Counseling. In 2020, he was awarded an Honorary Doctorate in recognition of his civic leadership and measurable impact in regional development.

Executive Leadership: City of Youngstown (2018–2025)

As Mayor and Chief Executive Officer of the City of Youngstown, Brown led comprehensive operational oversight of municipal functions while aligning local policy with state and federal regulatory frameworks.

Under his administration:

- Achieved **eight consecutive balanced budgets**
- Secured **four consecutive clean state audits**
- Increased the city's general fund from **\$176M to \$220M** through strategic business attraction, incentive alignment, and grant acquisition

Brown's public safety modernization strategy resulted in a **56% reduction in homicides** and a **20% decrease in overall crime**, driven by technology integration, including advanced surveillance systems, citywide drone deployment, and mandatory body-worn camera implementation for all sworn officers.

His economic development strategy generated **over \$200 million in public and private investment**, including a **\$74 million aerospace and defense hub initiative**, positioning Youngstown as one of four strategic hubs in Ohio.

Brown also prioritized neighborhood stabilization and housing equity, directing more than **\$20 million toward homeownership expansion, housing rehabilitation, and new construction**, while overseeing the removal of **3,400 blighted structures** to accelerate community redevelopment and improve quality of life metrics.

Fiscal & Administrative Leadership

Prior to his mayoral tenure, Brown served as Chief Deputy Treasurer for Mahoning County (2007–2018), where he managed operational administration, financial oversight, payroll systems, personnel policy modernization, and regulatory compliance initiatives.

He led process improvements, staff development programs, and community engagement initiatives that enhanced transparency and service delivery across county operations.

Earlier roles include Director of the Youngstown Human Relations Commission, where he oversaw civil rights investigations and policy enforcement; Community Organizer with YSU Urban & Regional Studies, facilitating neighborhood revitalization strategy; and leadership positions within child protective services, probation supervision, and labor representation. These roles collectively shaped his expertise in systems management, regulatory oversight, stakeholder engagement, and crisis navigation.

National Leadership & Strategic Affiliations

Brown's executive influence extends nationally through participation in the Bloomberg Harvard City Leadership Initiative, the Mayors Institute City Design Fellowship, and Yale Mayor Leadership programming.

He has served within the U.S. Conference of Mayors, including as Co-Chair of the Electric Vehicle Taskforce, and has been recognized with multiple leadership and innovation awards, including the U.S. Global Statesman Award and NAACP Strategic Game Changer recognition.
